


you to do so, and heck! Stay for dinner too. This is a wonderful time to fellowship and worship together as one family.

A NOTE FROM JOSH PHELPS

Dear Church Family,


I hope that you are enjoying a restful and restorative Summer! Those of you worshipping on our Central Campus today will worship within the context of a festival service that includes our Chancel Choir, the Westminster Brass and three of our immensely gifted organists. In recent years, you have likely noticed that our worship services are planned with careful attention to thematic continuity, and today is no exception. I would like to share a bit of background and perspective with you regarding the musical selections offered in today's service. Craig Phillips, a celebrated Oklahoman, organist, composer and conductor, wrote "Suite for Organ, Brass Quintet and Percussion" for the American Guild of Organists in 2001. It is a three movement work that is being offered sequentially as our prelude, postlude, and offertory selections. While the work is certainly worthy of exposure to vast and varied audiences, it is not performed as often as it perhaps should be, due to the demands that it places on the organist and brass players. I encourage you to join our Chancel Choir in remaining seated and attentive during the prelude and postlude selections so that you may enjoy this work to the fullest.

The Processional Hymn is sung to a new arrangement of "God of the Ages, Whose Almighty Hand" that was commissioned of Mark Schweizer in honor of charter members Jack and Eleanor Records and Ross and Kathryn Johnston. I hope that you enjoy the premier of this arrangement as much as we have enjoyed preparing it. Our Chancel Choir has worked very diligently on "The Challenge." This work centers around the hymn "Once to Every Man and Nation", which appeared in many of our previous hymnals. You will

hear four verses of that hymn, the text of which is printed in your bulletin for reference, bookended by a paraphrase of Alexis de Tocqueville's quote "America is great because she is good. If America ceases to be good, America will cease to be great." We offer this anthem and its admittedly challenging text as a reminder for all of us that the gospel of Jesus Christ is to guard and guide us, thereby transcending the polarization that currently prevails in many of our discussions. With similar intentions, we are singing our Hymn of Discipleship, the text of which also challenges us significantly, to the tune AURELIA, which is most commonly associated with "The Church's One Foundation." Hopefully, offering these familiar texts in this way will allow us to hear them afresh and consider their implications as we struggle with current issues.

As you know, our Chancel Choir has enjoyed an immensely fruitful 2017-2018 program year. In addition to their regular Sunday morning and Holy Day responsibilities, they have hosted a Reformation Hymn Festival, presented a service of Christmas music and spoken word on national television, and led the ecumenical Christian worship service for the regional convention of the American Choral Directors Association. Following worship today, they will be on Summer recess until August 5. I hope that you'll find time today to express your gratitude to them for a magnificent and impactful season of ministry.





A Note From Laurel Hall

You may have noticed that we've added a few things to our worship order lately. One of the additions is the *Gloria Patri*, which is Latin for "Glory Be to the Father." This is a centuries old response to our forgiveness - a way of ascribing glory to our three-in-one God for the grace we receive when we confess. In our modern age, many people have developed a broader, less gendered way of conceiving of God and the language of the *Gloria Patri* may feel a little too male for some of us. In keeping with tradition, many of us choose to use the old language with a broader understanding of its meaning, while some of us might want to substitute language that reflects a more comprehensive conception of God. What we don't want to lose in any language substitutions is the sense of familial intimacy that Jesus intended when he taught us to address God as "Abba" - an Aramaic term of endearment like "Daddy" or "Papa." I suggest to anyone who is seeking substitutes to overtly male language a few options: "Abba" or "Parent" for "Father" works well. As for "Son," Jesus was actually a male, so no substitution is necessary there, but if you're more comfortable with "Child" for "Son" please feel free. Join us in this ancient response to forgiveness in any way that opens your heart and mind to the glorious mercy of God.

Affirmation of Faith

Another recent addition to our worship order is the Affirmation of Faith. During this part of our worship service, the congregation is asked to stand (as each is able) and respond to the reading and proclaiming of the Word. Many of us grew up using the Nicene or Apostles' Creed as our affirmation of faith, and while both of these creeds are a part of our Book of Confessions, there is a wealth of suitable affirmations contained in the other confessions and catechisms of our faith inheritance. Each week, we will stand and say in unison a portion of one of our constitutional documents in a show of unity to affirm the faith of our baptism.

This is a perfect opportunity for your family to fit worship into your relaxed Summer schedule. Worship is at 5 PM and meal fellowship will follow at 6 PM. Today's fellowship will be at our North Campus.
