A NOTE FROM GLENN DUNN

Dear Congregation,

It's summertime and I hope you and your family are enjoying the many opportunities this time of year provides. Some of our fondest memories occur during the summer. Jesus said, "Only one thing is needed." What did he mean when he told Martha that and what does it mean for you and me today?

I invite you to join me this Sunday as we explore and think about together the "One Thing" Jesus is talking about.







A Note From Laurel Hall

Gloria Patri

You may have noticed that we've added a few things to our worship order lately. One of the additions is the Gloria Patri, which is Latin for "Glory Be to the Father." This is a centuries old response to our forgiveness - a way of ascribing glory to our three-in-one God for the grace we receive when we confess. In our modern age, many people have developed a broader, less gendered way of conceiving of God and the language of the Gloria Patri may feel a little too male for some of us. In keeping with tradition, many of us choose to use the old language with a broader understanding of its meaning, while some of us might want to substitute language that reflects a more comprehensive conception of God. What we don't want to lose in any language substitutions is the sense of familial intimacy that Jesus intended when he taught us to address God as "Abba" - an Aramaic term of endearment like "Daddy" or "Papa." I suggest to anyone who is seeking substitutes to overtly male language a few options: "Abba" or "Parent" for "Father" works well. As for "Son," Jesus was actually a male, so no substitution is necessary there, but if you're more comfortable with "Child" for "Son" please feel free. Join us in this ancient response to forgiveness in any way that opens your heart and mind to the glorious mercy of God.
