A NOTE FROM REV. DR. PAUL J. KIRBAS

Dear Congregation,

A very important envelope will be coming your way this week. It is a detailed report about the plan of action for the possible assimilation of Connecting Point, and instructions on how to participate in a congregational survey to help us discern the next steps in this consideration. It is very important that you take the time to read through the brochure, pray about what you have read, and then do the survey, which will take just a moment of your time. Our goal is to make sure we as a congregation make an informed decision, and we are doing everything we can to get the information to you. But now, it's up to you. So please do your part. Here's a recap of what it is about:

For over a year, we have been in conversations with Connecting Point, and with the Indian Nations Presbytery, concerning the invitation we have received to assimilate the property, building, and congregation of Connecting Point Presbyterian. We have been staffing Connecting Point with our seminary intern Laurel Hall. Under her leadership, the campus is already showing signs of growth. We have been using an assimilated bulletin on both campuses. And, we have prepared a detailed plan of action concerning the merger which has

been approved by our joint campus task force, both church sessions, and the Committee on Ministry at the Indian Nations Presbytery.

The car is packed, and we are ready to get into the driver seat and take a long and unfamiliar journey. But before we do, the first thing we must do is to check the gas tank. Is there enough fuel to make the journey? In this case, the "fuel" is our congregational will, our congregational excitement, our congregational vision to become a two-campus congregation. It's time to see how much fuel is in our tank. It is our hope that everyone will read through the information sent, prayerfully discern God's will, and then participate in the survey. This will give us a sense of direction as we move closer to this decision.

The car is packed. The road lies ahead. Now, let's see how full our gas tank is!
