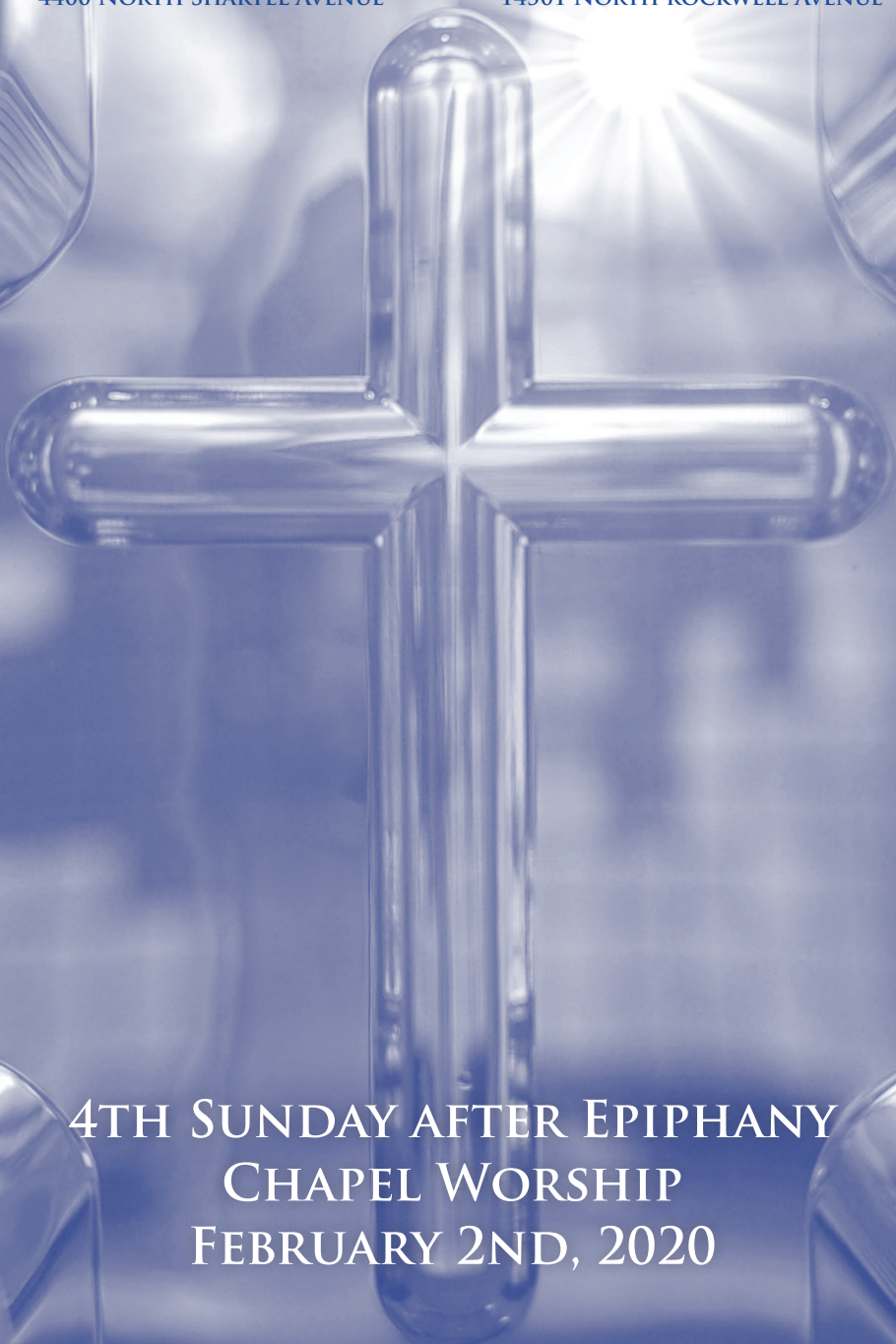

Dear Congregation,


As we move into the month of February, we are at the doorway into the season of Lent. Lent is the liturgical season in which we join the journey of Jesus as he makes his way toward his life's mission to demonstrate the extent of God's love by his willingness to endure the cross. It is not a physical journey that we take. Rather, it is a spiritual one.

Here at Westminster, we will truly make this journey a spiritual experience. As we gather for worship each Sunday in Lent, we will explore the theme of the Holy Spirit, as we consider the metaphors that the Bible uses to explain the Spirit and the way that the Spirit intervenes in our world and our lives. We will consider what it means to say that the Holy Spirit is the Wind of Heaven, the Breath of God. We will see how the Spirit is presented in the mysterious word of the "Paraclete," used only by Jesus himself. We will witness the Spirit presented as the intercessor, the fire, the dove, and the inhabitant of our bodies. In each of these Biblical metaphors, we will gain a deeper understanding of the Holy Spirit and will seek to sense the Holy Spirit at work in our church and our lives.

It is an important time to seek the presence and direction of the Spirit. Our nation is in turmoil, and our church is in a time of change. More than ever, it is important for us to seek the Spirit's guidance as we navigate the days ahead.

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, February 26. To celebrate the night before, we will bring back our popular Shrove Tuesday dinner party at the North Campus on Tuesday, February 25th. On Ash Wednesday, we will offer the imposition of ashes at both campuses at noon and will offer our Ash Wednesday worship service at the Central Campus in the evening. FOCUS ON FOUNDATION

February is "Focus on Foundation" month, when the Westminster Presbyterian Church Foundation highlights its activities and mission during each week's Moment for Mission. The WPC Foundation manages designated funds that exist solely for the benefit of the church and its facilities and ministries. The Foundation seeks to honor the past, sustain the present and nurture the future with six funds, each with a unique focus. In addition, the Foundation last year established the Birthday Club to celebrate meaningful birthdays through a Foundation donation to provide WPC staff with a Great Idea Grant for ministry-related projects. We hope that you will review the funds and find one that matches your passions.

Good Steward Fund

This is WPC Foundation's largest fund, and annual grants are made from this fund to the Session for the greatest needs of the church.

The G. Raymond Campbell Fund

The annual income from this original Foundation fund is split evenly between the Deacons' ministry to the needy and support of church members who are studying for the ministry.

Mission Fund

This fund ensures the funding of our church's mission activities, including Urban Mission, Infant Crisis Services, Dwight Mission, Habitat for Humanity, S.P.A.R.K. House, Mobile Meals, and TV Ministry, just to name a few.

Carillon Fund

This fund supports the maintenance of WPC's unique carillon which is 63 years old and one of only a few instruments in this region still in use. Played each Sunday by talented artist, Lisa Hart, the carillon sets the tone for worship through sacred music that can be heard around the church and in the surrounding neighborhood.

Education Fund

One of our newest funds, the Education Fund, was established to help support a multitude of educational opportunities at WPC, including adult education programs and other aspects of Christian education.

Youth Fund

The Youth Ministry Fund was established in 2010 and specifically supports the hiring of youth ministry summer interns as well as scholarships for youth mission trips.
